MULTI-ATTRIBUTE EVALUATION PROCESSES

A multi-attribute evaluation situation consists of a set of alternatives, each described on a number of attributes that may vary in importance, and a decision maker who is requested to evaluate these alternatives. This evaluation can be a numerical judgement of each alternative, the choice of one alternative, or any other kind of evaluation between these extremes.

In this workshop we intend to focus on current theoretical and methodological developments and empirical findings in research on multi-attribute evaluation processes. Workshop contributions deal with various topics and are ranged under the following headings:

(1) Underlying perspectives influencing evaluation:

cue versus component attributes,
features versus goals,
effect of psychotherapy perspective.

elicitation of weights,

Abstract

People generally believe that they are less likely than their peers to experience future negative events and more likely to experience positive events. These phenomena have been termed "unrealistic optimism." The presentations in the workshop deal with contributing factors such as perceived controllability and mood, different comparison targets and optimism toward non-self targets, comparing "negative" and "positive" optimism and direct and indirect measurement methods. Real-life consequences of unrealistic optimism are also discussed.

This workshop will cover a range of current approaches to risk research. Three contributors will discuss risk perception, focusing on some new conceptions (e.g., risk perception as politics) and some new analytic methods (e.g., structural modeling). Three other contributors will discuss various aspects of safety analysis in nuclear power plants. One paper will describe the use of barrier functions to protect the system from failure. A second paper describes the value of understanding employees' mental models of how operating incidents occur in nuclear plants; such models are important for facilitating cooperation and communication across levels and different functional groups. A third paper will present a decision theoretic approach to analyzing a critical sequence in the control of a nuclear power plant. These presentations will be followed by a general discussion of some important problems in current research on risk perception, risk analysis, and society risk management.

Workshop on Naturalistic Decision Making

Abstract

Studies of naturalistic decision making attempt to understand how human decision makers actually make decisions in complex real-world settings and to learn how to support these processes. Naturalistic decision making has four key features: (a) Dynamic and continually changing conditions, (b) real-time reactions to these changes, (c) ill-defined goals and ill structured tasks, and (d) knowledgeable decision makers. These features require certain departures from how decision making is conceptualized and studied within the framework of Behavioral Decision Making including (a) deemphasis of the Rational Choice model and its derivatives (heuristics and biases) as a basis for description and prescription of decision making; (b) de-emphasis of controlled laboratory experiments and naive subjects; (c) focusing on recognitioal processes and situation awareness as basis for description and prescription and (d) greater appreciation of how expert decision makers operate in naturalistic settings. The first session of the workshop consists of a tutorial on naturalistic decision making and a review of selected naturalistic decision making models. The second session consists of presentations of three naturalistic decision making studies.

Emotion and Decision Making

The role of emotions is receiving increasing attention in research on behavioral decision making. The goal of the workshop is to present and discuss some approaches to and important facets of the impact of emotions in decision making. One focus is on emotions underlying the formation of preferences. Can preferential judgments be decomposed into specific emotions, what are the conditions for emotions such as regret, hope, etc. to arise, and which emotions are most important im making choices? How do such approaches relate to traditional models of utility maximisation? A second topic is the role of mood on probability and utility judgments and on the selection of decision strategies. Additionally, the question arises how people cope with strong emotional arousal and stress during a decision process. As a third topic, studies on regret and disappointment theory, originally proposed as generalisations of the expected utility model, will be discussed. Anticipations of future emotional states are assumed to influence choices. This relates to the problem if there is a place of emotions in normative approaches. The first session of the workshop will deal mainly with the impact of emotions on choices in various decision situations, and with the influence of mood on decision processes. The second session will be mainly on regret and disappointment theory.

INTRODUCTION TO JUDGMENTAL FORECASTING WORKSHOP

Nigel Harvey

Forecasting is ubiquitous in modern society and its failure often has drastic effects upon our

lives. Examples of poor forecasts leading to poor decisions are found in many domains:

economics, business, finance, transport, energy provision, epidemiology, educational

provision. The workshop will be concerned primarily with the use of unaided judgment to

make forecasts on the basis of information that is either explicitly displayed in a graph or

table or else held in the forecaster's memory. Three main issues will be addressed. First,

what is the nature of the cognitive processes that underlie forecasts and assessment of

confidence in forecasts? Second, what sort of errors do forecasters make and how are these

best explained? Third, how are forecasts affected by expert knowledge of the variable being

forecast and by experience with the task of forecasting?
